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A few reminders

A few reminders as the new term gets underway:

Ruck sacks/Book bags – we ask that the children do not bring ruck sacks to school at the moment. Children are currently keeping their belongings by their chair and so ruck sacks take up a lot of their floor space. Please send them to school with a book bag if possible. If they have no book bag, please use the smallest bag they have for their book, lunch and water bottle. Thank you.

Start and finish time – please try and arrive at school at your designated drop-off and collection times. School has worked hard to stagger starts and limit the number of people arriving at school at the same time and your support with this is essential and much appreciated. Thank you.

Uniform – The new uniform looks fantastic and the children are so proud to be wearing it. It really is great to see. Please ensure that all uniform is named so it can be returned if lost.

Birthday treats – although an incredibly generous gesture, we have to ask that no birthday sweets are brought into school to be shared out at this time. The guidance is clear that the children must not only limit what they bring from home but also limit the things they share. Thank you.
