CCTV Cars

Nottinghamshire County Council have asked that we reinforce the message of the importance of not parking illegally outside a school.

"Nottinghamshire County Council uses CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally. If vehicles are in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice. These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles. The school can request enforcement from the car so, if you have any concerns regarding parking, please notify us and we will arrange for a visit."

The County Council will also be sending us posters with the message on which will be displayed in and around school in due course. Thank you
