Parking

Nottinghamshire County Council have asked me to message you about its efforts to improve parking outside schools by the scheduled patrols of its CCTV enforcement vehicles.

They have asked me to share the message below which outlines how you can support this and get involved if necessary.

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally. If vehicles are parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice. These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles. The school can request enforcement from the car so, if you have any concerns regarding parking, please notify us and we will arrange a visit.
