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Parking & The School Car Park

A quick reminder to please be mindful when parking in The Lambley Kitchen. There are very few bays we cannot use but the agreement was that we would leave them free. It is my understanding that we are sometimes parking in these bays and so I ask that we all abide by the agreement so we can work together with the pub to ease parking before and after school. Thank you.

Please also only use the school car park before and after school if you need access to the disabled bays. There are lots of parents and children walking up the drive at this time and to keep our community safe, I ask that you only come up the drive at these times if you need to park in a disabled bay.

Finally, the school drive will be closed for the summer holidays as works are done to re-tarmac the surface. This work will also see the footpath (currently stopping half way up the drive) extended to a full footpath so you can walk your children all the way up to school without needing to step on the drive (which may be being used for disabled bay access at key times.)

Timings for September

As you know, we need to subtly change our school timings from September to meet the Government's minimum expectation of 32.5 hours per week for every child.

As such, I just wanted to remind you, ahead of September, of these timings.

R/KS1

- Gate will open at 9am
- School day will start at 9:05am (instead of 9:10am)
- School will finish at 3:35pm (instead of 3:30pm)

KS2

- Gate will open at 8:40am
- School day will start at 8:45am (instead of 8:50am)
- School will still finish at 3:15pm

Like now, for those of you with children in both Key Stages, please bring them all to school for the earlier time (between 8:40-8:45am) and collect them at the later time (3:35pm).
